<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⤴ Ask your child how their day was and how they are doing ⤴ Teach your child proper safety in and for various situations ⤴ Adhere to the safety and age requirement guidelines on products ⤴ Childproof your house and living areas for your children ⤴ Stay up-to-date with current events, safety announcements, and news ⤴ Teach proper bike safety, use lighting, encourage wearing pads ⤴ Speak to your child calmly when discussing safety ⤴ Inform your child of predators and the ploys they may use ⤴ Teach your children that it is okay to say no to situations ⤴ Listen to your child and talk to them ⤴ Monitor your child's school progress and how they interact with others ⤴ Take a CPR course or learn CPR ⤴ Practice proper car and automobile safety necessary to your kid's age ⤴ Keep a close eye on your child's internet and computer activities ⤴ Use guides, images, and other resources to help inform ⤴ Contact your school district if you have any concerns about safety ⤴ Inform yourself of abduction checklists and 101 for kids ⤴ Show your children right and wrong with interaction and others ⤴ Safeguard weapons, sharp objects, liquids, and other household items 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⤴ Take your eyes off of your toddler or infant, even for a moment ⤴ Use a booster seat that doesn't match your child's specs ⤴ Sacrifice quality in terms of safety equipment or gear ⤴ Set a negative example ⤴ Leave children unattended ⤴ Get bubble boy syndrome or overly protect your child (deprive them) ⤴ Use scare tactics to teach safety ⤴ Overlook talking to your children about safety and tactics ⤴ Allow your child near bodies of water without proper safety gear ⤴ Ride a bike after dark (for kids) ⤴ Permit your child to freely browse the internet or the computer ⤴ Fail to childproof your home and living areas regularly ⤴ Leave dangerous objects out such as cleaners or liquids ⤴ Lose your temper or cool when explaining safety 101 to kids ⤴ Beat yourself up for having to leave your child with a babysitter or care ⤴ Be afraid to search high and low for the proper child care if need be ⤴ Expect your child to always open up about what's going on in their mind ⤴ Leave anything within reach of a toddler, ie: on the floor, etc. ⤴ Lecture your child when you talk, try to level with them as equals ⤴ Buy used safety equipment ⤴ Be naïve to child safety from day 1
